Annual Meeting August 17

Our annual meeting will be held on August 17th at MacPherson Park. Our meeting follows the HOA annual meeting and will start around 10am.

We will be covering the status of the company and upcoming projects. This is a great time to ask any questions you may have, providing the company with feedback, and getting to know the board and staff. We look forward to seeing you there.

Minimizing Water Waste

In September there will be a 3-year warranty inspection and cleaning of the water tower. During that time, the tank will be out of service. The work will take approximately 5 days. During this time, the well will run continuously supplying the system with water.

Because the well has a minimum volume of water that it can provide we needed to come up with a way to exhaust any excess water off the system. Instead of wasting water onto the ground, we decided to install an Underground Injection Control point at our older well.

This new functionality will maintain a specified pressure in the system. Once that pressure has been reached, the excess pressure/water will be forced down the well and back into the aquifer.
